UNIPC Lieutenant General Fang Wenjun Attends and Delivers Speech at the 4th World Police Summit in Dubai

From May 13 to 15, 2025, the Middle Eastern city of Dubai, UAE, hosted a globally significant event—the 4th World Police Summit and the Military, Peacekeeping, Counter-Terrorism, Investigation, and Police Equipment Expo. Lieutenant General Fang Wenjun, Senior Commissioner of the United Nations International Police Center (UNIPC), UN Representative, and Special Envoy with Full Authority, was invited to attend on behalf of UNIPC. He was accompanied by Lan Wei, Secretary-General of the East Africa Alliance Fund of the United Nations International Peacekeeping Fund and Assistant to Lieutenant General Fang Wenjun.

This summit was not only a grand gathering of global police elites but also a brilliant platform for exchanging policing concepts, showcasing cutting-edge military and police technology, and jointly exploring strategies for global peacekeeping, counter-terrorism, and combating all forms of crime.

20,000 Global Security Experts Convene as UNIPC Promotes Vision for World-Class Police Education

Nearly 20,000 participants gathered from top military and police institutions, counter-terrorism experts, investigative professionals, and police equipment manufacturers across 138 countries and regions—including representatives from UNIPC, the United Nations International Peacekeeping Development Fund (UNIDPDF), and Interpol (ICPO)—to explore new challenges and opportunities in the current global security landscape.

Lieutenant General Fang Wenjun delivered a keynote speech titled: “Striving to Build the UNIPC International Police Security Academy into a World-Class University,” which received widespread recognition and support from attendees.





Future of Policing Unveiled in Dubai

At the summit venue, a dazzling array of high-tech police equipment was on display—from intelligent drone patrol systems and advanced biometric technologies to high-efficiency counter-terrorism and explosive disposal tools and precision investigation and forensics equipment—fully demonstrating the increasing technological and intelligent nature of modern policing.

During the summit, multiple keynote speeches, roundtable forums, and live tactical demonstrations were held to establish an open, inclusive, and cooperative platform for international exchange, promoting in-depth communication and collaboration among law enforcement personnel from various countries. Discussions focused on key topics such as peacekeeping and counter-terrorism strategies, combating transnational crime, and cybersecurity protection—seeking innovative solutions and new paths to tackle global security challenges.

Global Leaders Unite for Policing Excellence

Through a variety of engaging activities, every participant experienced the honor and vitality of policing work and contributed to writing a new chapter in the development of global law enforcement.

Distinguished attendees included Lieutenant General Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan, UAE Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior; Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum, President of the Dubai Civil Aviation Authority, Chairman of Dubai Airports and Emirates Airline & Group CEO; and Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum.

The opening ceremony was attended by global police leaders, international peacekeeping and counter-terrorism experts, and key decision-makers in the security sector, all of whom came together to confront global challenges and share best practices.



Cybercrime Takes Center Stage at Dubai Summit

At the opening, Dubai Police Chief Lieutenant General Abdullah Khalifa Al Marri delivered a welcome speech, expressing his honor in hosting the summit and warmly welcoming representatives from UNIPC, ICPO, and national police forces. He highlighted the growing threat of transnational and cybercrime, including AI-based fraud, dark web activities, and digital scams. In 2024 alone, over 100 billion personal and financial records were traded on the dark web, a 42% increase from the previous year. Ransomware attacks accounted for around 25% of global cyber insurance claims.

This summit was held under the patronage of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President, Prime Minister, and Ruler of Dubai.
